BEST PRACTICES

URBAN DESIGN - NETHERLANDS

Urban planning contributes to improving the sustainability of cities. It would be optimal if cities were to increase the overall stock of housing by converting the intended use of empty buildings from business to residential - then choosing whether to place only migrants or both migrants and residents, in the latter case with greater opportunities for integration.

One of the examples is that of the Netherlands, where since 2010 local administrations have prepared a plan aimed at encouraging the conversion of buildings into residential use. The plan was based on the assumption that buildings conceived for office use only, "depopulating" the neighbourhoods, generate degradation and discourage business investments.



INTEGRATION SUPPORT - VIENNA



Since the summer of 2015, on their journey from the Balkans to the heart of the European Union, over 600,000 refugees have passed through Austria. The city of Vienna alone managed 300,000 people, to whom it was able to offer assistance thanks to the collaboration between the municipality, civil society, and social service operators, and the skills and service-oriented approach adopted by the city's public services.

In addition, the Municipality has activated an application, a website, and a telephone line that offer institutions and citizens information on the general situation, on the actions underway, and on the needs of the operators. The Municipality has also made available the municipal ambulances, the cleaning staff of public housing, and granted three days of leave to municipal employees who want to provide voluntary services.
